## Getting the Balance Right

We believe that education should be part of living and not separate from it.

Our co-curricular programme has been carefully devised to make a wider impact on our students: to influence character development; to develop teamwork; to inspire service to others; to promote a healthy lifestyle and to pursue excellence.

We believe in this wholeheartedly, so we have shaped the weekly timetable accordingly, so that it includes, amongst other things, MAD (Make a Difference) Monday – allowing a full afternoon a week to dedicate to co-curricular activities such as CCF, sport, charity work, creative arts, academic extension or outdoor pursuits.

### Day and boarding pupils: A caring community

Students thrive in a caring and comfortable community.

Pastoral care is a vital element in the success of our pupils' education - students will thrive in a happy environment where they feel well-known and well cared for.

Pastoral care comes in many different layers. Every pupil belongs to one of our four houses and are members of a tutor group which meets daily. Housemasters and Housemistresses work closely with tutors to ensure that the children's welfare is monitored as carefully as their academic progress and that communication between school and home is effective. In addition, we have introduced regular team building activities, peer-to-peer mentoring and access to on-site counsellors and wellbeing experts, offering reassurance, support and advice.

Boarders in Years 7 - 11 enjoy a close community in our single-sex boarding houses, whilst our Sixth Form live in Parker's, which houses 70 single en suite bedrooms, kitchens and a variety of spacious social areas. All boarders can take part in an extensive choice of evening and weekend boarding activities including surfing, coasteering, cooking, swimming and yoga.

Boarding does not aim to replace family life but to supplement and strengthen it and our weekly boarding offer is increasingly popular. Our boarders benefit not only from easy access to sport and study facilities but also from being part of a vibrant boarding community.

Christian practices and values are part of the school's life but students of all faiths or none are welcomed and encouraged. Our school Chaplain is available to all students and staff during the day.

#### **School Transport**

Our extensive daily bus service covers North Devon and beyond to ensure as many of our local pupils as possible have access to the service. Most weekday sporting and extra-curricular activities will conclude in time for buses home in the evening.

The bus carries a nominal termly fee and is used by the vast majority of our students from both the Prep and Senior school.

We operate a pick up and drop off service to Heathrow at the start and end of every term for international students.

Our students enjoy impressive sporting facilities, including the Jonathan Edwards Sports Centre which includes a first class fitness suite and full size sports hall, with capacity for a basketball court, four badminton courts, four cricket nets, indoor tennis, hockey, netball, and five-a-side football.

Outdoor sports facilities include cricket, rugby and football pitches, an all-weather hockey pitch, sixteen tennis courts, two squash courts, two shooting ranges and a 25m indoor pool.

In addition to an extensive fixture list for rugby, hockey, netball, cricket, basketball and tennis, we also offer coaching and competition in cross-country, athletics, swimming, football, shooting and squash.

Our performance programmes in tennis, boys hockey and netball support talented sportsmen and women through a pathway that will ensure their development.

Physical challenges are not restricted to the sports field. We hold regular strength and conditioning sessions for senior students and have recently introduced classes in yoga, meditation and martial arts, which are extremely popular and form an important role in ensuring student health and wellbeing.

Dance is also extremely popular, with a wide range of dance disciplines available to all ages.

The Exmoor Run, which has been an annual crosscountry event for over 150 years, is an exciting event for the school and a notable feature of the Spring Term.









## A leader in the arts

The performing and creative arts are of great significance at West Buckland and we set high standards which our students constantly exceed.

The 150 Building is a superb statement of the school's commitment to creativity with facilities that rival the best in the country. There are three art studios, including a bespoke Sixth Form art studio, which A-level students can always access. Many of our artists go on to study art or architecture at some of the country's best universities and art colleges.

Design Technology students work in two first class workshops together with a dedicated ICT room. They have opportunities to employ a wide range of media and cutting-edge techniques.

The 150 Building also includes a fine 120-seater theatre, used for curriculum drama, dance and school performances. Many pupils embark on LAMDA exams and specialist speech and drama lessons. All students are encouraged to take part in the house and school drama programme, enhancing their directorial, production and script writing skills as well as acting.

The lively, vibrant Music Department runs a wide range of junior and senior choirs, orchestras, jazz and concert bands and chamber groups. These have numerous opportunities to perform throughout the year within and outside of school.

Pupils are encouraged to try a wide range of instruments in curriculum music lessons before embarking on their musical journey and a full programme of formal and informal concerts provides opportunities for musicians at all levels to perform in front of an audience.

Individual instrumental and singing lessons are available.

### Future ready

The Sixth Form is the pinnacle of school life and we encourage our students to express their own views, think independently, develop their own ideas and gain the confidence to succeed in life beyond school.

Students will choose between the A-level/BTEC programme or the IB Career-related Programme (IBCP) - recently introduced - which is a mix of vocational and academic studies. Both routes support entry to higher education and, invariably, our results will sucure students into some of the world's top universities.

The opening of Parker's, our new Sixth Form house, has created a friendly and close-knit community. As well as 70 single en suite bedrooms, Parker's has vibrant and welcoming communal areas where both boarders and day pupils can relax and socialise, creating a strong identity for Sixth Form students.

The Michael Morpurgo Library has a dedicated area for Sixth Formers, providing an ideal working environment for A-level study.

Boarding is very popular in the Sixth Form and many students choose to weekly or full board, enabling them to use the facilities and access the schedule of extracurricular activities in the evenings.

Students are offered extensive career and HE options advice from external specialists and leaders of industry and receive monthly newsletters, updates and ideas from our excellent HE and Careers Department.

We also have a vibrant programme of Life Skills courses, from self-defence to managing finances and car maintenance.







### Sixth Form Diploma

Our Sixth Form Diploma has been developed as part of our commitment to prepare students for an enriching future. It encourages our students to explore and experience a range of co-curricular activities and challenges, ranging from academic enrichment to service in the community and sport, to develop the character values that form the very core of the school. Students are encouraged to reflect on their choices and what they have learned.

### The Great Outdoors

Making the most of our outstanding location.

With a strong focus on wellbeing and providing a healthy lifestyle for our students, we offer a balanced curriculum which includes numerous opportunities to take part in outdoor learning and adventure.

From Year 9, pupils can join the Combined Cadet Force, engaging in activities from flying and sailing to shooting, camping and first aid, as well as exercise weekends on Dartmoor and Exmoor.

Our busy outdoor learning department provides opportunities to climb, kayak, surf, coasteer and trek both in North Devon and further afield. We enter multiple teams into the famous 'Ten Tors' expedition on Dartmoor and support impressive numbers of students through their Duke of Edinburgh Awards at all levels.
